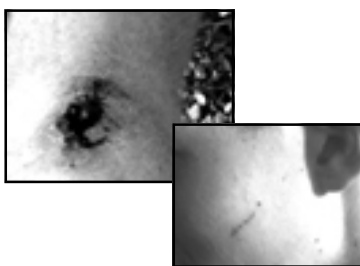
Did You Know?
