Campers Give Impromptu Piano Recital

Nurse Reports Wide Range of Health Issues

In an exclusive interview with a member of the *Record's* investigative staff, Camp Nurse Mary Yoder reported that she has already seen six cases. One injury is reportedly a pre-existing condition, and was described as a “post-canine-attack” puncture that was no longer bleeding, but “kind of like still red.” Two other injuries were so minor as to have been forgotten – at least by the nurse.
