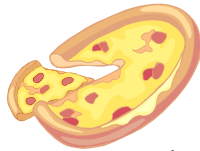

Female Counselors Report Boys are Losers



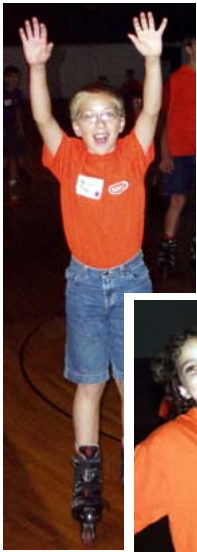
