what "eh" means, but some people think that it is the sound made when someone's brain gets really cold.

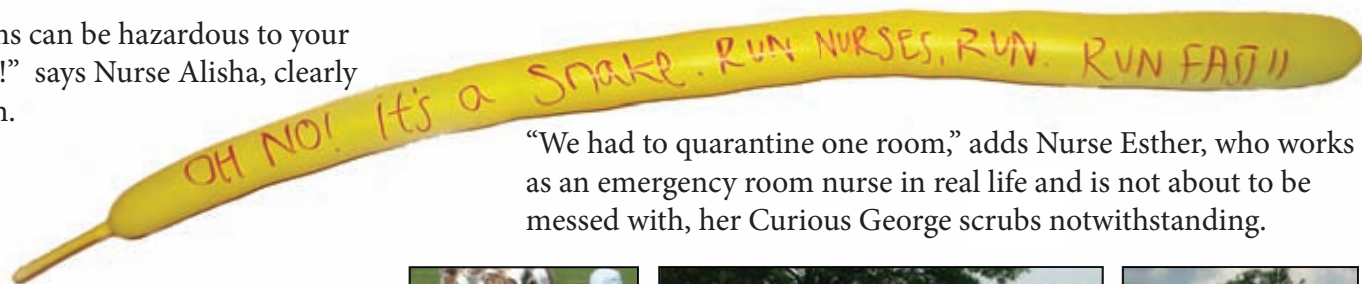
Some play a sport called curling, which was invented in Scotland and involves throwing chunks of rock across frigid ice.
