## BUILDING DEVELOPMENTS

The School Board has moved to secure the services of the Associated Church Builders, Inc. of Illinois in the erection of the new Library-Chapel. ACBI will be doing a detailed campus lay-out along with planning for the Library-Chapel Complex. It will take from four to six months before any blueprints or plans can be finalized.

During the past fifteen years, ACBI has erected over 1000 buildings. In many of these cases, they have been able to build better buildings and at a lower cost because of the volume of materials they purchase. They stress multi-purpose buildings as being both economical and practical. ACBI will oversee all payments and do on-site inspection as well.

Before building can be begun, money must be on hand. It is our hope that very little, if any, money will need to be borrowed for this project. It will be interesting to see how the Lord will provide for this need.
