#### **Music Teacher Unbalanced**



### **Camp By the Numbers**

Choral Camp draws a wonderfully varied mix of campers and staff. Although nearly two-thirds of campers came from three states (DE, OH, PA), others traveled here from eight other states. One even came from the country of Nicaragua, in Central America!

While most campers came from Mennonite congregations (84%), several other denominations were also represented. In ascending order by number of campers, these include Assemblies of God (1), Friends (1), Nazarene (1), United Methodist (1), Christian and Missionary Alliance (2), Missionary (2), Word of Grace network (2), nondenominational (2), Evangelical Free (3), Vineyard (3).
