Signs on the door declared "This is an official No Nurse Zone" and "Nurses! No bribes for you ever!!!"

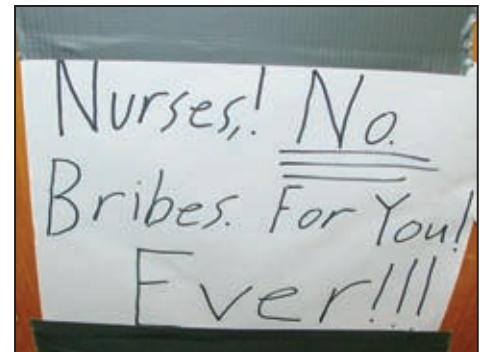
The brave, über-confident nurses, however, did not shirk their duties, despite the dire warnings. They entered the room, no doubt equipped with haz-mat suits.

On leaving, the nurses had several words

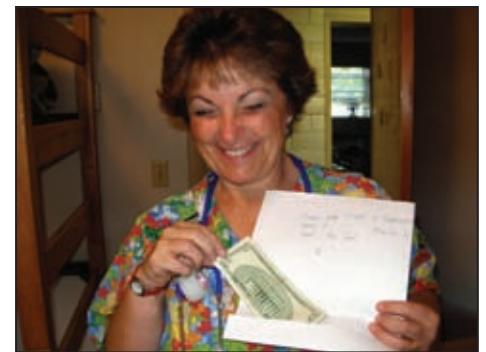

Q: What are some of your favorite hobbies?

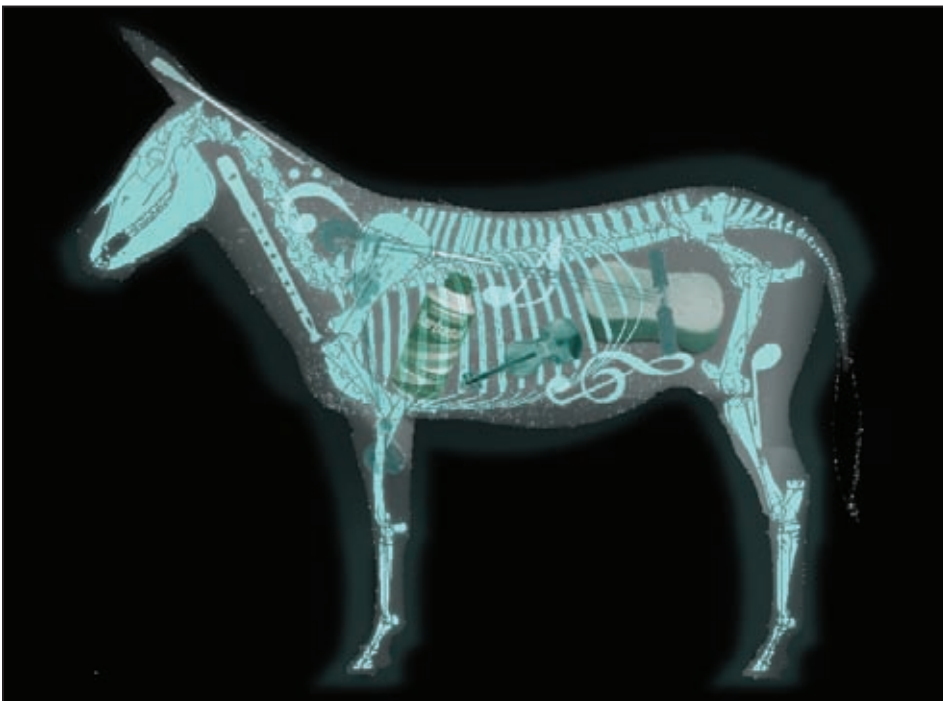
A: Swimming and playing with a Chinese yo-yo called a diabolo.
