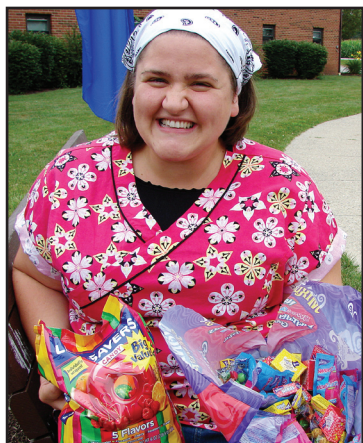
"The whole thing is BAM!—so amazing!"
