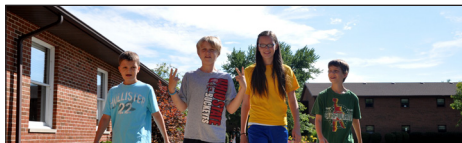

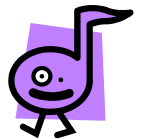

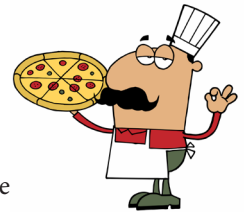


TUESDAY'S MENU
