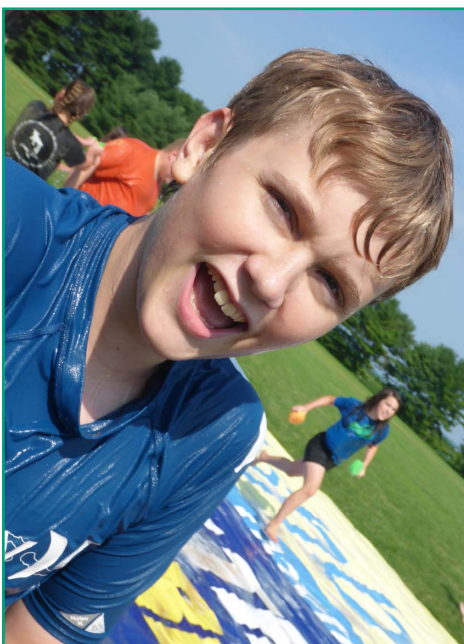

Little Paquito, where are you? Why did you leave? Is it something we did? If you come back, we'll make sure you get all your favorite foods. Please come back to us soon!

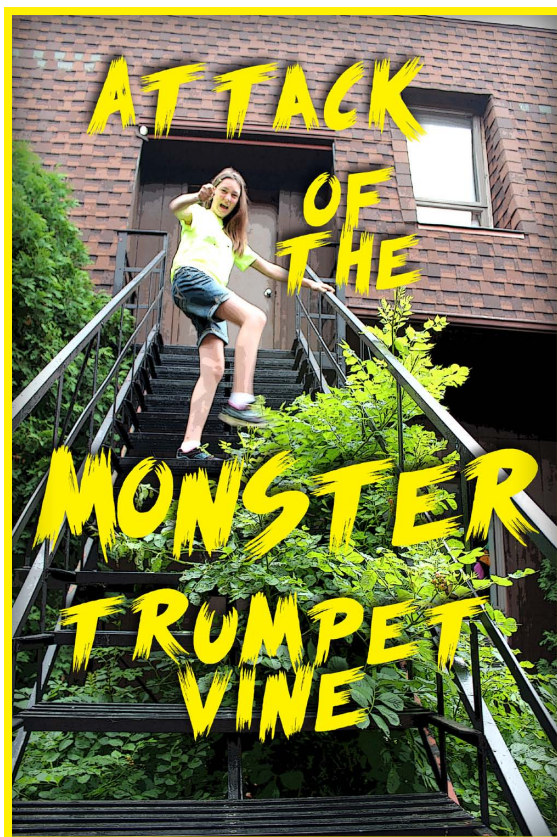
Paco, ¿dónde estás?
