

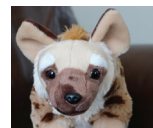


Wednesday's Forecast

She has a theory: "Sara has a sister who's in Crew. I'm not making any accusations, I'm just putting that out there."

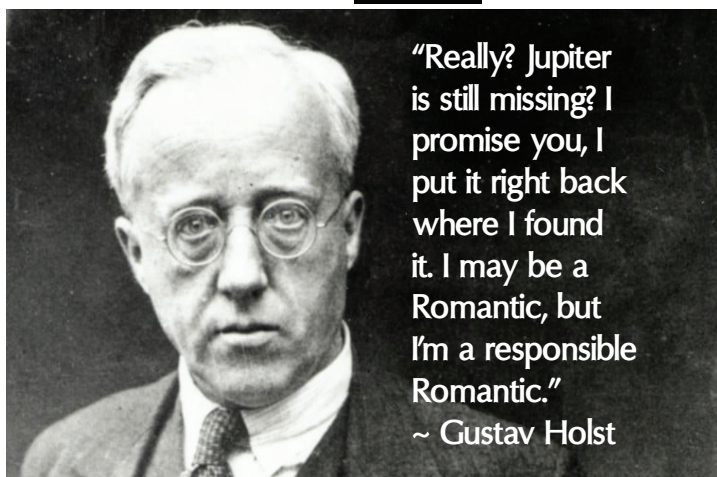
Jenalyn Miller thinks the guys are at fault. "They sneaked in and stole it," she said. Why? "To start a prank war."

Music instructor Jared Stutzman has the more intriguing theory, mainly because it involves a wild-eyed English composer and Dr. Who's Tardis.

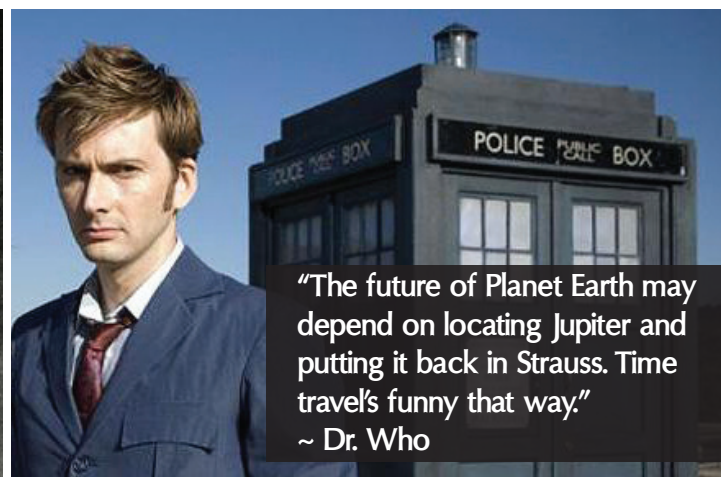
"Clearly Gustav Holst used the Tardis to travel in time and borrow Sara's Jupiter because he needed it for inspiration while composing his suite *The Planets*."
