MAKING A DIFFERENCE

This past October the Eastern Kentucky Chapter of the Rosedale Bible Institute Alumni Association held its annual meeting at Bethel Camp, a beautiful spot nestled in the hills of Appalachia. Approximately 30 people were there, coming from Bowlings Creek, Turners Creek, Lost Creek and other watery, poetic-sounding places that grace Eastern Kentucky.

The activities included a business meeting, potluck meal and a service (the meeting began on a Sunday afternoon). The evening service included group singing, special music and a devotional. Ken Miller, director of development and music instructor at RBI, gave an update on the school and a short inspirational talk. They also took

an offering, collecting almost \$600 for RBI and over \$300 for a scholarship fund that the group has established.

The Eastern Kentucky alumni chapter began in December of 1990, and has met every fall since then. John Yoder, a member of the chapter's executive committee, sees the purpose of their association as providing a means to keep in touch with RBI and to work at ways to generate interest in the school among their young people. They recently awarded a scholarship to a young man in their area, John Morris, who graduated from RBI in 1998 and is now the interim pastor at Lothair Baptist Church, Hazard, KY. John Morris says that RBI was a very stretching experience for him: "It was a time of

focusing on growing in Christ along with other believers. I loved RBI!"

Besides helping students like John Morris come to RBI, the group enjoys spending time with each other. "I really enjoy getting together and reflecting on our RBI days," John Yoder says. "We have a wide variety of ages from Berlin to the present. It's neat to see all the generations come together with a common goal."

Spotlight on a Few of the Attendees

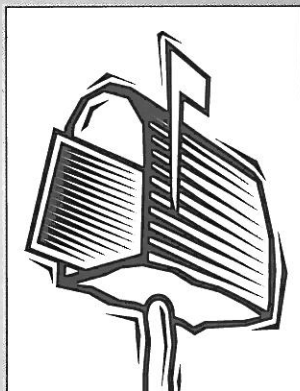

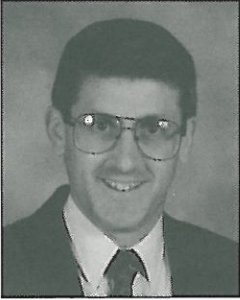

They Prayed

When I was a young boy, a severe split took place within the Mennonite churches in my home area of Eastern Pennsylvania. Although I was too young to remember the resulting tensions and broken relationships, I do recall that one church lost most of the young men who were then in their late teens, a group of about ten. They were about eight years older than I, and I knew most of them.



About fifteen years after the split I had a conversation with Elmer Ebersole, a pastor at that church during the split. He shared with me how much pain he still felt regarding the split, especially how it had affected those young men, none of whom were serving the Lord at that point. Elmer confided in me that he had made a commitment during the days of the split to pray every day for those young men by name, a commitment he had kept. I was awed by my brother's commitment to prayer.

Last summer while on vacation in Belleville, Pennsylvania, my family attended Maple Grove Mennonite Church. As we arrived the service was getting under way, and I opened

the bulletin to find that Erie Renno was scheduled to preach that morning. I had never had the opportunity to get to know Erie well and do not recall hearing him preach before. When the service was over we made our way to the back door where I greeted Erie, told him who I was and thanked him for his inspiring message. His response: "You are Leon Zimmerman. I prayed for you this morning." He went on to explain that he follows the RBI Daily Prayer Guide and that my name was on the schedule that day. I was astonished—this near stranger had prayed for me that very morning!

These are just two examples of godly men who prayed. They took seriously God's invitation to interact with Him and "sought first the Kingdom" with constant, fervent prayer.
