In an era of anger, anxiety, and declining cultural Christianity, I feel a strange, warm excitement about the future of God's people and the work of RBC.

The Scriptures speak of God's people as strangers and aliens who move through this world with transformed minds. The light of Christ in their lives shines brightly, like a city on a hill. They engage with a broken world, traveling the narrow way through thorny questions. They suffer with grace, enduring misunderstanding without compromising the gospel or demeaning their enemies. They live with a deep submission to God revealed in Christ through the Scriptures. Their communities are bettered by their presence as they live in light of the new Kingdom. Their lives belong to the King.

RBC exists to train these sorts of people - Kingdom workers!

As RBC has considered its calling and our present age, we feel compelled to make room for more students and new initiatives by upgrading key facilities on campus over the next decade. The first phase of campus preparation is the addition of a new dorm.

Over the past few years RBC's enrollment has trended up. Last year our student body grew by more than 20%. This growth comes at a time of broader cultural skepticism about the value of higher education. Many colleges and universities saw steep declines in enrollment.

We sense that young adults are hungry for rootedness, longing to understand their faith, and desperate for a non-anxious but deeply convictional walk with Jesus. We continue to design our way of life at RBC to speak to these desires. We believe God is raising up Gen Zers to walk with Him. We pray regularly for the opportunity to equip more of God's people.

In addition, we feel compelled to help facilitate renewal in Christ's church, preparing God's people for deeper intimacy with Him, greater surrender to His purposes, and a passion for His Word. The summer months provide opportunity to serve the broader church, but our current facilities significantly limit how we are able to live into this calling. A new dorm with air conditioning and reconfigured restrooms will give capacity to serve the church in new ways.

In this issue of the Mirror, you'll see how God is using some of our recent grads. You'll find information on the dorm we are planning to build. I trust God will move your heart to invest in the training that happens here at RBC.




We Need a New Dorm!

Training in Ministry (TiM) Retreat is a summer retreat geared to complement the online TiM courses, but open to all who are longing for spiritual refreshment. (No cost for TiM students)



One Night is a semiannual event for Ohio youth groups to come together for an evening of worship, encouragement, games and (of course) snacks. RBC students help to lead worship and organize events.



Explore sends students into the community to volunteer in various ministries such as tutoring, worship leading, Country Closet Thrift, International Friendships, and Daily Needs Assistance. RBC students complete at least 12 hours of service/semester complimenting their academic studies.



Rosedale Invitational is an annual high-school basketball tournament co-hosted with Shekinah Christian School for both men's and women's teams. RBC students assist with hosting.



Choral Fest is a biennial high school choir festival bringing together choirs from around the eastern and mid-western U.S. for a weekend of fun, spiritual input, and musical development. Dozens of visiting choir members and leaders pack into all available sleeping spaces (which are quite limited!) on campus.

"THEY DISCIPLE PEOPLE HERE!"

In the fall of 2018 our staff and faculty set aside 40 days to pray, research, and plan. We knew our mission was to prepare Kingdom workers, but the college was struggling with low enrollment and changing realities. We knew we had to become absolutely clear about what we were doing and where we were headed.

What emerged powerfully in the concluding twoday summit was a culminating sense that, "we need to strengthen our focus on discipleship." I left the summit with numerous strategic initiatives in hand. I was excited for the future and ready to implement changes to campus life.

Shortly thereafter our family traveled to Kansas for Christmas. Then after the holidays as we travelled I-70 back to Ohio, waves of panic began to wash over me. I thought about next steps and mountains we'd need to climb. **Disciple students**. Would that really make the college thrive? What if we heard wrong? What if we're too small-minded? Is that too simplistic?

Suddenly, in the midst of the besieging doubts and fears, my phone rang. It was an out-of-state pastor friend. We visited together several times a year, but he knew nothing about our 40 days of prayer and planning or the focus and initiatives stemming from it.

"Jeremy, you have time to talk?" he asked. "Sure," I said, welcoming anything that diverted my anxious thoughts. "I had a dream this morning, and it was so vivid I felt like I needed to call you." I confess to feeling a bit guarded when a conversation begins like that! But he continued.

"In my dream I was walking with a friend and crested a hill. I looked down, and there was Rosedale. It was full of people. There were buildings being built with cranes and other equipment. I was shocked and curious about why there were so many people at RBC. We walked onto campus, and I began asking people what was happening. They said, "They disciple people here!"

I began to weep as my friend continued, "I don't know what that means, and it all felt really odd to me."

I knew what it meant, and in that moment I sensed the Holy Spirit reminding me that God was indeed leading us! We don't know what the future holds or what new ventures God will bring our way, but we are committed to making disciples, preparing them for effective service in Christ's Kingdom. We do so confidently. This is our calling!
